Businessman and senior executive David Spence has been appointed as the incoming Chairman of the Internet of Things Alliance Australia (IoTAA). David is passionately committed to driving digital transformation across the economy, and to attaining greater investment from government and industry to achieve this aim.

David Spence said, "I'm excited to be joining the IoTAA at such an important time. COVID-19 has enabled digital transformation at the speed previously thought unimaginable, and has brought to light the opportunity presented by the Internet of Things to connect the physical and digital world. [David Spence](#) has been involved in over 25 internet and telecommunication businesses since the early 90s. Born in South Africa, David joined Consolidated Press on arriving in Australia in 1989. He joined pioneering ISP OzEmail as COO in 1994 and has been CEO, founder, chairman of many internet businesses, including CEO of Unwired, the pioneer of wireless broadband and Chairman of Vocus which went from start-up to ASX 100 in seven years. Today, David chairs PayPal Australia, National Narrowband Network Co (NNNCo), DiscoveryAG, GoannaAg and Canopus Networks. He recently co-founded a new business AllThingsEncrypted to look at new ways of encrypting IoT networks.

We are delighted to have appointed someone of David experience and calibre as the incoming Chair.
